Charades Charts Activity

- 1. In preparation, the instructor will write the different types of visual/sensory aids (e.g., PowerPoint, flowchart line chart, etc.) on separate notecards.
- 2. The instructor will put students into groups of three.
- 3. Once students have moved into their assigned groups, the instructor will walk to each group and have them draw one visual/sensory aid notecard.
- 4. As a group, students will choose a topic (e.g., object, character, person, movie, etc.) that fits the sensory/visual aid that is on their notecard.
- 5. After 10 minutes, each group will come up to the front of the class and act out their visual/sensory aid in a game of charades with the rest of the class.
- 6. The objective of charades is to guess what object, person, character, movie, or TV show the group is acting out (*without talking*).
- 7. Each group has a one-minute time limit to nonverbally act out their aid and their chosen topic.
- 8. After the group's one-minute time limit is up, one person will draw their visual/sensory aid on the board while the other two group members will explain to the class how it represents their chosen object.
- 9. The class will then ask questions or provide constructive criticism.
