Visual/Sensory Aid

- 1. In preparation, instructor will write the different types of visual/sensory aid types (PowerPoint, flowchart, line chart, etc.) on notecards.
- 2. On a separate notecard, the instructor will write nouns—for example, New York City, Elvis Presley, guacamole.
- 3. Instructor will put students into groups of three.
- 4. Once students have moved into their assigned groups the instructor will walk to each group and have them draw two notecards, one from each pile.
- 5. The students will then come up with a connection between the noun and the sensory/visual aid.
- 6. Each group will come up to the front of the class. One person will draw the visual/sensory aid on the board and the other two group members will explain to the class how it represents their noun.
- 7. The class will then ask questions or provide constructive criticism.
