- Because I am an only child, <u>used</u> to having my own way and my own room all to <u>myself</u>, I found adjusting to living in the dormitory difficult<u>;</u> I had to share a room, a desk, a closet, and sometimes even my clothes. <u>You</u> never know what a roommate will decide to do. <u>No error</u>.
- A species <u>is</u> a distinctive form of life, there is no question that computers are distinctive, <u>but</u> it is ridiculous to argue that a machine is <u>like</u> a human being. <u>No error</u>.
- 3. Whenever people discuss the idea of women in the world of men, a male voice always cries out that women are biologically different <u>than</u> men, even in the animal kingdom; the term "biologically different" is usually <u>used</u> to mean inferior, an expression of a <u>male's</u> prejudice. <u>No error</u>.
- In addition to telescopic <u>photos</u>, the astronomers <u>who made the discovery</u> used a sophisticated electronic <u>spectrograph</u>, <u>which</u> uses a color-spectrum breakdown of light from galaxies to determine <u>their</u> speed and position. <u>No error</u>.
- 5. "You might be the <u>best</u> basketball player in the entire conference," should my father <u>"but you</u> still have to be able to read Shakespeare <u>and know how to write correctly." No error</u>.
- Adults choose mystery stories for the same reason children <u>liked</u> fairy tales. The appeal is the <u>same: the battle between good and evil. No error</u>.
- Researchers have found that regular exercise not only improves <u>one's</u> body physically, <u>but the</u> major <u>side-effect</u> is the increase in <u>psychologic</u> and emotional well-being. <u>No error</u>.

- 17. An impartial judge was needed for the contest; therefore, John, who was completely <u>uninterested</u> and highly respected, was <u>chosen</u>. <u>No error</u>.
- In China, adherence to a rigid structure, centralized planning, social conformity, and group identity <u>have</u> been <u>nation</u> assets. <u>No error</u>.
- A growing number of talented young Japanese in science, <u>business</u>, and the arts <u>are</u> gravitating to the <u>West</u> in search of a <u>freer</u> working atmosphere. <u>No error</u>.
